As most of the AWG members know, a dedicated group of Santa Claus contract workers gather at Andy Borland's North Pole South Workshop on Monday mornings. Throughout the year they manufacture a marvelous fleet of charming and durable wooden toy trucks, cars, planes and whatnots to be given to deserving and desirous children at select local elementary schools. This year's efforts produced more than 2,500 toys. The shop overseer must have really flogged his cadre of gray haired elves. They scrounge and salvage the necessary material and consumables needed for this level of near industrial levels of

effort. A reliable supply of suitable wood is always a point of concern. Fortunately, one of our local wood merchants has begun to assist by donating rough cut lumber to be used in this endeavor. Dennis Woodruff, the owner of Maryland Select Hardwoods, has stepped up for us. He tossed poplar, cherry, oak and maple boards for the toy program in my truck after I picked up my project supplies. He had done this previously and said that he will continue to help us out. This last trip gained us about 75 board feet of useful hardwood, and would have been more had I more room in my S10. In addition to being a good guy, he has a good selection of wood at great prices. His lumber mill also features a well stocked fishing pond. I have found it worth the trip down the road to deal with him.

Product Reviews

Bora Centipede Portable Worktable By Carl Wick

For a while I have been wanting a portable worktable that I could set up quickly in my shop and store away when not in use to save my very limited shop space. Recently, I spotted a product from Bora in a Rockler catalog that I thought would fit my need. I quickly "arranged" for a Bora Centipede table base and surface as a Christmas present. I should point out that two separate products are needed for a table: an expanding set of table legs and a foldable table surface. I ordered a 2x4 foot 30" high table base and a matching surface with holes for clamping (several different surface configurations are available).

What I received was two cartons. One carton held an expandable set of legs along with a leg storage bag. A separate smaller bag contained sturdy plastic holders sized for 2x4 lumber and a pair of plastic hold-down clamps. The second carton held a 2x4 table surface of 3/4" hardboard hinged in the center and a set of six clamping pins to firmly affix the table to the legs.







The base is light in weight, but very strong in compression. It is quickly expanded (less than a second required) to its final size and shape of just a little larger than the 2 x 4 foot nominal size. At this point X-shaped plastic fittings could be inserted in the base to form a series of sawhorses using 2x4 lumber as the horse crossbars, but I am more interested in a strong table surface. This is formed by unfolding the table surface and placing it on the legs, then clamping it to the leg base with some 'cam-lock' pins that are inserted and twisted from the underside of the table surface. The table surface is heavy, but manageable by one person.



Once set up the table is amazingly stable and strong - rated to support 2500 pounds. It takes very little time to set up and take down, fitting all my requirements. This product is certainly worth a look if you have a similar need. Leg sets are available in 2x4, 4x4, 4x6 and 4x8 sizes with all tops formed by multiples of the 2x4 tops. The 2x4 leg set is also available in a 36" high versions. You can find all the information on the Bora website- https://boratool.com/work-stands.
